TOWN OF LENOX ANNUAL TOWN MEETING May 7, 2015

At 7:00 p.m. the Annual Town Meeting held at the Lenox Memorial Middle High School was called to order. A quorum for the meeting was met with over 103 present at the opening. It was voted unanimously to waive the reading of the warrant and return of service thereof and to authorize the moderator to declare a 2/3rds vote on voice votes If he deems it so.

ARTICLE 1.

It was moved, seconded and approved unanimously to authorize the Selectmen to choose all Minor Town Officers to wit: Field Drivers, Pound Keepers, Fence Viewers, Surveyors of Lumber, Wood and Bark, Sextons and Seater of Weights and Measures.

ARTICLE 2.

It was moved, seconded and approved unanimously to authorize the Treasurer to enter into a compensating balance agreement or agreements for Fiscal Year 2015 pursuant to Chapter 44, Section 53F of the General Laws.

ARTICLE 3.

It was moved, seconded and approved unanimously to authorize the Town to appropriate \$92,708.93 for snow and ice removal costs, said sum to be transferred from Free Cash as certified on July 1, 2014 and added to the amount appropriated to the Snow and Ice line item under Article 3 of the Warrant for the 2014 Annual Town Meeting.

ARTICLE 4.

It was moved, seconded and overwhelming approved that the Town raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds in the treasury, money for the operating expenses of the Town for Fiscal Year 2016 as follows. After considerable discussion regarding the school budget line, and other line items which had increased substantially, it was overwhelmingly approved.

ARTICLE 8. It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved to authorize the Town to raise and appropriate the sum of \$258,383 for library services to be provided by the Lenox Library Association in Fiscal Year 2016.

And further, to provide for said appropriations, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$687,738, to transfer from Free Cash as certified on July 1, 2014, the sum of \$1,140,000.

ARTICLE 10. It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved for the Town to appropriate the sum of \$650,000 to the Board of Selectmen for the purchase of fire apparatus and related equipment.

And further, to provide for said appropriations, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200,000 and to transfer from the Fire Engine Stabilization Fund the sum of \$450,000. [2/3 vote required]

ARTICLE 11.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved that the Town accept funds being provided by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts under the provisions of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, to pay for such costs as allowed by appropriate legislation in connection with the maintenance, repair, and construction of Town ways and bridges.

ARTICLE 12.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved that the Town vote to appropriate or reserve from the Community Preservation Fund annual revenues in the amounts recommended by the Community Preservation Committee for project debt service in fiscal year 2016, with each item to be considered a separate appropriation.

ARTICLE 13. It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved that the Town vote to appropriate or reserve from the Community Preservation annual revenues in the amounts recommended by the Community Preservation Committee for committee administrative expenses, community preservation projects and other expenses in fiscal year 2016, with each item to be considered a separate appropriation.

ARTICLE 14.

It was moved, seconded and passed by majority vote for the Town to appropriate or reserve from the Community Preservation Fund annual revenues **in** the amounts recommended by the Community Preservation Committee for committee administrative expenses and community preservation projects and other expenses in fiscal year 2016, with each item to be considered a separate appropriation.

ARTICLE 15.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously voted that the Town authorize the use of a revolving fund for the Community Center for all departmental programs which shall not exceed the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) which shall be under the control of the Town Treasurer, which shall be accounted for separately, and to which shall be credited only the receipts received in connection with the programs supported by the revolving fund; further to authorize the Community Center Director to expend from such funds in accordance with Chapter 44, Section 53 E' of the General Laws, provided however that said expenditures for the revolving fund shall not exceed the receipts for said fund.

ARTICLE 16.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously voted that the Town appropriate the sum of \$360,000 to pay costs of designing a sewage pump station to be located **on** Henry Avenue, including to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, is authorized to borrow said amount under and pursuant to Chapter 44, Section 7(22) of the General Laws, or pursuant to any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the Town therefor. [2/3 vote required]

ARTICLE 17.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously voted to appropriate the sum of \$850,000 to pay costs of replacing the Yokun Avenue sewer line, including the payment of all costs incidental and related thereto, and that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, is authorized to borrow said amount under and pursuant to Chapter 44, Section 7(1) of the General Laws, or pursuant to any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the Town therefor. [2/3 vote required]

ARTICLE 18.

It was moved, seconded and after considerable discussion, the article failed to pass. The article asked that the town authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into an agreement or agreements for parking easements or leases with any or all of the owners of property **on** Ore Bed Road between Tucker Street and Housatonic Street or their successors, heirs or assigns for parking of vehicles, on such terms and conditions as the Board determines to be in the best interest of the Town.

ARTICLE 19. It was moved, seconded, and unanimously voted to modify existing language in the Lenox Historic District Commission Bylaw to simplify the appointment process and maintain explicit conformity with M.G.L. Chapter 40C by inserting "When possible" at the beginning of Section 3.1a.

ARTICLE 20. It was moved, seconded and carried by over a 2/3 vote to amend the Lenox Zoning By-laws by adding a new section entitled Section 11. Large-Scale Ground-Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Installations. Alt attendees were provided with a copy of the proposed bylaw. [2/3 vote required]

ARTICLE 21. It was moved, seconded and the motion failed to pass by a vote of 70 in favor and 75 opposed (2/3 vote required) for the Town to amend the Lenox Zoning By-laws by adding a new section under Section 5 General Regulations, Section 5.1 Off-street Parking and Loading Requirements, entitled Village Center Parking Overlay District, 5.1.20 Parking and Loading in Downtown Lenox. All attendees received copies of the proposed bylaw.

ARTICLE 22. It was moved, seconded and unanimously voted to have the Town grant an easement to Massachusetts Electric Company for overhead and underground systems which are located in, through, under, over, across and upon a certain parcel of land situated on the northwesterly side of Pumping Station Road, being more particularly described in a deed dated January 18, 1878 recorded with the Middle Berkshire District Registry of Deeds in Book 237, Page 211.

ARTICLE 23. It was moved, seconded and unanimously voted to authorize the Town to negotiate terms and execute, on such terms and conditions as the Town Manager and Board of Selectmen deem in the best interest of the Town, one or more renewable energy purchase and/or net metering power purchase agreements for a term of more than three years, for the purchase of net metering credits to be generated from one or more solar energy project(s) now or hereafter located in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and to take all actions necessary to implement and administer such agreement.

ARTICLE 24. Citizen Petition - Plastic Bag Ban. After discussion which included a member of the Lenox Environmental Committee, the article was passed over.

ARTICLE 25. Citizen Petition - Styrofoam Ban. After discussion which included a member of the Lenox Environmental committee, the article was passed over.

After a reminder from the Moderator to vote in the Town Election on Monday, May 7, 2015 the meeting was adjourned at 9:38 P.M.
