Youth Services Report: Amanda states in her report that our after school Program is going great. We have 71 kids per week, with a few less on Friday's.

On June 17th being the last day of school, we had 26 kids on board.

Guys Night Out: 8 folks participated in a fun evening at Ore Bed Park.

Memorial Day went well with our kids marching and such in the Lenox Memorial Day Parade.

Summer Camp- We have 85 kids registered, with 19 being new to our Program. We had 82 kids last year. We show less in certain age groups.

Amanda has many Field Trips and different events scheduled to keep the kids enthusiastic during Summer Camp. Check out Facebook to see pictures and what is happening next.

Senior Services Report: Sue tells us that 66 people and 4 volunteers attended the picnic hosted by Wingate Residences at Melbourne Place. Eric Aasheim from Oasis Senior Advisors absorbed the cost of the Sunday Strummers ukulele band. Kimball Farms Nursing Center is interested in hosting a summer luncheon on July 23.

31 of our folk enjoyed the trip to Hildene in Manchester, VT. It was a great trip, we took a "Party Bus" and everyone found it to be a fun way to travel.

Jeff Zeif conducted the AARP's Safe Driver course last week with 11 people attending the 4 hour class.

On July 29th Town Assessor Randy Austin will be coming to answer questions and speak about property tax values and how they are assigned, etc.

Our exercise classes are all going well. Our varieties of classes include-Tai Chi, Osteo, Yoga, and Line Dancing. Poker and Majong have also become quite popular.

Sue shares that she made 8 outreach calls that resulted in 5 general information conversations and 3 home visits. Sue made an additional 3 home visits to known seniors with difficulties.

Our van continues to be extremely busy with 18 different people using the van in May.

Jen Picard tells us that she had folks asking about Game Night.

Caroline – Program Coordinator, has no new updates on the Age Friendly Berkshires Steering Committee.

Berkshire Elder Care network meetings- Caroline along with Darlene and Sue attended the June meeting. The Brien Center presented at Devonshire Estates about seniors mental health and substance abuse. Caroline spoke to Edita Rudzinskiene, Amedisys Home Health, she is interested in doing a presentation here at the Center. Both Darlene and Caroline attended the Western Mass Elder Care Conference and learned a lot of helpful tips about technology fraud among seniors.

Friday Movies: May 17th- "The Greatest Showman" and June 21st- "The Green Book" had 22 and 18 people attend. On July 19th the movie will be "Dumbo".

Upcoming senior events/programs

Mondays with me: May 20th- State of the State coffee hour; 17 people attended and Smitty spoke about his legislative priorities for the upcoming

session as well as how to promote the Berkshires. Smitty touched on bringing young people in to start filling jobs and making it more accessible for them to do so. Smitty also spoke of creating vocational programs and shared cost.

June 3rd – Helping the Bees Survive and Thrive in the Hive- Joanne Davis with Northern Berkshire Beekeepers, did not charge a fee for comingrather, have us make a donation to the Bennington County Beekeepers Club. Joanne brought in her beehive and explained how they worked. She shared samples of honey, and told the best way to promote bee health. We had 8 people attend.

Darlene met with Chris Ketchen regarding the Beach and opening and locking up. The Beach is to be open at 8:00, however, no one showed to open the gate. We will continue to iron this out.
