Proposed Zoning Bylaw Sign Section 7-2

7.2.9. Temporary Signs

- 1. Temporary signs on private property do not require a permit and <u>may be off-premises</u> with permission from the property owner.
- 2. Temporary signs on public property shall be approved by the BOS.
- 3. Temporary signs may be in place up to 14 days prior and shall be removed no later than 7 days after their associated activity or event.
- 4. A permit for a permanent sign allows for a temporary sign, consistent in size and content, to be in place while the permanent sign is being fabricated.
- 5. The following signs are allowed in all districts, on or adjacent to the property.
 - a. <u>Trade signs (such as contractor, architect or designer signs)</u> are each allowed one sign while a project is under construction, each not more than six (6) square feet in area.
 - b. "Open" and "Closed" signs, each not more than one square foot in area. Flags that only contain the word "Open" are considered to be a temporary sign. They are limited to one per business and shall not be more than fifteen (15) square feet in area.
 - c. Opinion signs, each not more than six (6) square feet in area.
 - d. Political signs, each not more than six (6) square feet in area.
 - e. Realty signs in all residential districts and in the C district, one not more than six (6) square feet in area and one additional sign for a property on a corner lot.
 - f. Realty signs in the C-1A, C-3A and I districts, one not more than twenty-four (24) square feet in area and one additional sign for a property on a corner lot.
 - g. Special event signs are limited to one free-standing sign per event per property, not more than six (6) square feet in area and one one-sided, on-building sign per event per property, each not more than six (6) square feet in area.
 - h. Any sign that does not comply with these 7.1.1.5 requirements, requires a special permit from the Zoning Board of Appeals.
- Pole Signs on public property
 - a. Are allowed in all districts.
 - b. Shall be reviewed by the Building Commissioner and the BOS and shall be installed by the Lenox DPW or the MassDOT.
